Partnership arrangements with other groups

- *There are links with the local community childcare centre and primary schools which support community partnerships and smooth transitions to school.*
- *The kindergarten accesses the local library through walks to participate in literacy programs.*
- *Opportunities are also available to connect with the local High school through visits and work experience student programs. The High School comes over during the year, to teach the kindergarten children some Ngarrindjerri language and songs.*
- *Preschool children can access local bus runs which drop off and pick up at the kindergarten to provide access to children in isolated areas on the Fleurieu.*
